

## Evolution and Chronology of Public Housing:

- **1960s:** The first housing blocks were simple long slabs with small flats.
- **1970s:** The Housing Board began experimenting with different housing shapes. The New Town model was implemented, with neighbourhoods ringed around a town centre, like Macpherson.
- **2000 onwards:** Greater emphasis was placed on better views, increased privacy and high tech or green features. The Pinnacle@Duxton has been acknowledged as the public housing project that has revolutionized the definition of "public housing".<sup>4</sup>

Did you know?

Before the 1960s, Singaporeans lived in squatter settlements and single storey sheds under terrible living conditions due to a widespread shortage of housing. In an effort to improve these living conditions, the Housing Development Board (HDB) was set up. As of 2017, 80% of Singapore's resident population is housed in HDB flats, with a satisfaction rate of 91%.<sup>1</sup>

## Homeownership in Singapore

In 2015, homeownership in Singapore reached an astounding 92%, much higher than that of Hong Kong, a much larger country. This is testament to the housing policies and strategies HDB has developed over the years to ensure that quality living spaces are provided for Singapore's residents.<sup>2</sup>

Singapore's resident population is housed in three main types of dwellings- 80% in HDB flats, 14.4% live in condominiums and other apartments and 5.2% in landed properties.<sup>3</sup>

## Moving Ahead

Emphasis is shifting from simply providing necessary housing and accommodation to a more macro approach, which involves developing housing in the context of its surrounding living environment. Landscaping and aesthetics serve to boost the identity of each precinct and foster a greater sense of belonging in residents.




