Search for Information

Don't just limit yourself to going online for research. Go through library books and encyclopaedias that could have more detailed information which could be beneficial for your final report.

- Library Catalogue
- Reference Books (e.g. encyclopaedias, dictionaries)
- · Journals and Magazines
- Library Databases



Evaluate and Select the Information

You're almost there! With all the notes and information you have, put them all on the table and read through again and again. Are these sources credible enough to help define a conclusion? Are these sources related to the subject you are researching? Check and double check!

- Is the information source reliable?
- Is the information correct?
- Is the information up-to-date?
- Any bias?





Take Notes

Make sure to not just read up on what you need but also take down important notes along the way. Photocopy pages or write down what is important that can help in your understanding and reports.

- Photocopies
- Note cards
- Fact finders
- · Data sheets
